This is not the way I had planned to fill in for Glen, but I was well-prepared, as he and I, and our staff worked very closely together on the major decisions made on behalf of Academy.

Glen's obituary appear in both the latest CQ and in the last issue of the Monitor.

Most of Glen's Colleges have been taken care of after an honest audit of each.

- * Unfinished projects were either closed or picked up by a faculty member.
- * Spec Ops colleges were gathered together for the new MACO Institute.
- * IOPFR and IOMS Colleges that did not pass an audit were closed. Promising exams from those Colleges will be consolidated and moved into new Colleges. This project is in progress.
- * His active Colleges were taken over by his Assistant Directors and new faculty members.

Kudos go to TJ Allen , Chris Boggs, Kelli Caplette, Cher Schleigh, Jill Rayburn, and Robin Fleming for their continuing efforts to purge, merge, and reorganize the large number of projects and Colleges that Glen left us.

Kudos goes to the members who stepped in to handle Glen's popular Colleges. There was a good deal of shuffling this last 3 months, which prevented me from publishing an updated Course Catalog until changes slowed down. A copy of the latest Course catalog may be downloaded from the main SFIAcademy.org main site, as well as via second-hand distribution throughout the fleet.

LOOKING AHEAD:

In order to attract our younger members, future topics in Academy will focus on the development, discovery, and future of real-life technological, scientific, and medical advancements. Other Colleges will be updated, especially entertainment, movies, and TV shows. Dead and outdated material will be retired in such a manner as to preserve the members' records. My hope is to provide a compact and tidy Academy to the next Commandant, who will be seated January 1, 2020.

STARFLEET is working with The Royal Manticorian Navy fan club to acquire a new database to replace our 20-year old, patched together database, which becomes more "buggy" as it ages. We don't know how much of the existing DB will successfully be transferred over, so **it is highly recommended that Members periodically copy their records off site.**

As we work through our planned projects for 2019, we anticipate offering our members new and interesting topics to explore.

My primary job with SFA is Academic Coordinator, and what this means for you is that if you have a curriculum issue that you have tried to resolve with a director and/or dean, I am your next stop. With the start of the new year, I want to begin with suggesting that everyone participating in SFA make a personal goal of some sort that you want to reach in 2019. Maybe it is to earn your first Boothby, earn one of our SFA degrees, or simply take one course a month. If you are on staff, a good goal would be to grow your college(s) by adding new courses or topics, or helping another director with their college. Whatever makes you happy. I think that if you look at our extensive list of colleges and courses, you will find that we truly have something for everyone.

Any student who has not taken the courses in the STARFLEET Academy Orientation College, I would encourage you to do so. SO YOU WANT TO BE A DIRECTOR

Basic requirements are: Be at least 18 years of age and have taken OTS and OCC. Cadets at least 14 years of age may serve with an adult mentor.

To assume a vacancy, you must pass all of the exams in the College, or if a College of 35 to 60 exams, 75% of the exams. Colleges over 60 exams are tested out at 50%, with a maximum of 50 exams required.

Assistant Directors must meet the same requirements as the Director.

To direct a College of your own creation, first check the College Catalogue to make certain your idea is not already being used.

If the concept is not being used elsewhere, submit a College outline, exam, and key to the Course Development **Contact Jill Rayburn at: jazdansfa@gmail.com**

She will determine where your College fits within the Academy structure and introduce you to your Dean, who will lead you through the approval process.

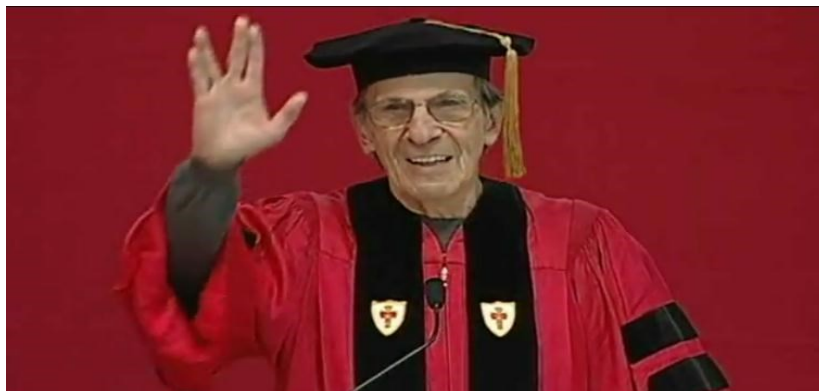

IN LOVING MEMORY OF STAN LEE

Stan Lee born **Stanley Martin Lieber** on December 28, 1922 passed away on November 12, 2018. He was an American comic-book writer, editor, and publisher. He was editor-in-chief of Marvel Comics, and later its publisher and chairman, leading its expansion from a small division of a publishing house to a large multimedia corporation.

In collaboration with several artists – particularly Jack Kirby and Steve Ditko – he co-created fictional characters including Spider-Man, the Hulk, Doctor Strange, the Fantastic Four, Daredevil, Black Panther, the X-Men, and – also with co-writer Larry Lieber – the characters Ant-Man, Iron Man, and Thor. In doing so, he pioneered a more complex approach to writing superheroes in the 1960s, and in the 1970s, challenged the standards of the Comics Code Authority, indirectly leading to it updating its policies.

Following his retirement from Marvel, he remained a public figurehead for the company, and frequently made cameo appearances in Marvel Cinematic Universe films. Meanwhile, he continued independent creative ventures into his 90s.

Lee was inducted into the comic book industry's Will Eisner Award Hall of Fame in 1994 and the Jack Kirby Hall of Fame in 1995.

He received a National Medal of Arts in 2008.

NASA SHARES PHOTOS OF A GALAXY CLUSTER THAT LOOKS LIKE STAR TREK'S ENTERPRISE

If *Star Trek* taught us one thing, it's to hope for something fantastic out there in the distant stars far beyond our solar system. Whether its lush planets, alien life or our own future, something spectacular awaits us out there.

And, hey, maybe there really is a Spock. If there is, perhaps he lives in the Abell 1033 galaxy cluster?

NASA recently unveiled new photos of Abell 1033 that show the cluster



to be *two* galaxy clusters in the process of colliding. And they just so happen to resemble the distinctive shape of the Starship Enterprise.

"This image of Abell 1033 also provides an example of *pareidolia*, a psychological phenomenon where

familiar shapes and patterns are seen in otherwise random data," [NASA explained](#). "In Abell 1033, the structures in the data create an uncanny resemblance to many of the depictions of the fictional Starship Enterprise from Star Trek."

To help outline the similarities, the agency pointed out the "saucer section" and "stardrive section" formed by the galaxy clusters.

The galaxy cluster sits approximately 1.6 billion light years from Earth.

The dazzling image, which reminds us a bit of "The Lights of Zetar," was made possible by NASA's Chandra X-ray Observatory.

Star Trek Fleet Command is being published by Scopely who publish a number of licensed freemium mobile games including *WWE Champions* and *Walking Dead: Road to Survival*. “We wanted to create a cinematic, action-packed, genre-defying game that embraces the heart of the franchise—exploration, to allow players to experience an entire galaxy of quests and missions for endless adventure,” said Tim O’Brien, Chief Revenue Officer at Scopely.

Naomi Watts To Star In ‘Game Of Thrones’ Prequel For HBO

After lengthy negotiations, Naomi Watts has signed on to lead the ensemble cast of HBO’s *Game Of Thrones* prequel pilot, from writer Jane Goldman and author/*GOT* co-executive producer George R.R. Martin.

Created by Goldman and Martin and written by Goldman based on a story by her and Martin, the untitled prequel takes place thousands of years before the events of *Game Of Thrones*. It chronicles the world’s descent from the golden Age of Heroes into its darkest hour. And only one thing is for sure: from the horrifying secrets of Westeros’ history to the true origin of the white walkers, the mysteries of the East to the Starks of legend... it’s not the story we think we know. The creative team behind the project is not giving away much about Watts’ character — she will play a charismatic socialite hiding a dark secret.

Goldman serves as showrunner and will executive produce alongside Martin as well as fellow *GOT* co-executive producer Vince Gerardis and *Damages* and *Bloodline* co-creator Daniel Zelman. Added since the June pilot green light are former BBC Studios executive James Farrell and Jim Danger Gray (*Orange Is the New Black*, *Hannibal*) as executive producers and Chris Symes (*The Alienist*) as co-executive producer. As previously announced, *GOT* creators/exec producers David Benioff and D. B. Weiss have no involvement in the potential offshoots.

GOT, created by Benioff and Weiss, has a male lead, Jon Snow. Looking to differentiate itself from the mothership series and coming from a female writer, Goldman, it was a logical assumption that the prequel could have a female lead, something Watts’ high-profile casting seems to reaffirm. That is not exactly the case, HBO President of programming Casey Bloys told *Deadline* in July.

“There are very strong female characters but it’s an ensemble, there are men and women,” he said. “Jane is a very good writer, we don’t want to limit her to writing female leads. There are a lot of very complicated leads in (the pilot).”

None of the actors from the current show will appear on the prequel, which originally was set 8,000 years before *GOT*. “It’s a very different setting, a very different time in Westeros, It will feel different but still *Game of Thrones*.”



Lenovo Unveils the Titanium Enterprise NCC-1701A Star Trek PC

High End Custom Star Trek PC

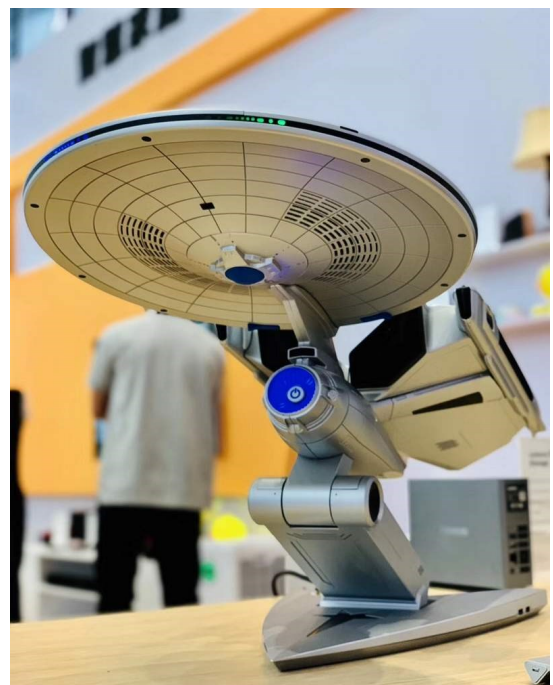
Lenovo recently held their Tech World Conference 2018 in Beijing. While there were many PCs and laptops on display, one particular PC stole the show. It is a custom mainframe PC designed in the shape of the USS Enterprise NCC-1701A from Star Trek. Even the power-on switch is integrated in the thruster intake part. The piece is also officially sanctioned by CBS and Paramount Studios.

Inside it has the latest that Intel and NVIDIA have to offer. That means it has an Intel Core 9th generation CPU with 32GB of DDR4 and an NVIDIA GeForce RTX 2080 GPU. It also packs 1TB of M.2 NVMe SSD with a 2TB mechanical HDD. It even has a Killer Networking LAN with a Killer high-performance WiFi onboard. Aside from the internal hardware, the PC also includes a built-in 400 ANSI lumen display projector.

The surrounding side of the disc has RGB LED built in. It supports 16 million different colours and is controllable remotely through an app.

How Much is This PC?

The one-off custom PC obviously does not come cheap. In fact, according to Gizmo China, it has a price tag of between 15000 to 20000 Yuan. That converts to about 1,600 to 2,200 GBP and **2,078 US\$ to 2,858 US\$**.



Star Trek Animated Comedy In Development With ‘Rick and Morty’ Writer

It seems the *Star Trek* series is ready to boldly go into the land of comedy. Thanks to a new announcement, fans have learned CBS All Access has ordered an animated comedy set in the *Star Trek* universe, and it will show a whole new side of Starfleet.

According to reports, the new series will be called *Star Trek: Lower Decks*. It will contain half-hour episodes focusing on the support crew of one of the Starfleet’s least important ships. So, fans can expect plenty of replicator hijinks to come around.

The show is being developed by Mike McMahan who will also act as executive producer. He will be joined by Alex Kurtzman, Heather Kadin, Rod Roddenberry, Katie Krentz, and Trevor Roth.

In a new statement, Kurtzman broke down how McMahan’s vision won over the team and pushed *Star Trek: Lower Decks* into production.

"Mike won our hearts with his first sentence: 'I want to do a show about the people who put the yellow cartridge in the food replicator so a banana can come out the other end.' His cat's name is Riker. His son's name is Sagan. The man is committed."

As for McMahan, the Emmy-winning writer from *Rick and Morty* said working on this show is a surreal dream come true.

"As a life-long Trekkie, it’s a surreal and wonderful dream come true to be a part of this new era of *Star Trek*. While *Star Trek: Lower Decks* is a half-hour, animated show at its core, it’s undeniably *Trek* — and I promise not to add an episode at the very end that reveals the whole thing took place in a training program."

So far, there is no casting information connected with the new series, and story details are sparse. However, Trekkies will notice something special about the show’s title. After all, “Lower Decks” is the name of a famous episode of *Star Trek: The Next Generation*. The episode follows four junior Starfleet officers on the Enterprise as they gun for promotions, and numerous sci-fi series like *Doctor Who* have referenced the title in its own episodes.

For now, there is no word on when *Star Trek: Lower Decks* will go live.



Blade Runner Anime TV Series “Black Lotus”

“The ‘*Blade Runner*’ universe is an incredibly deep well for story and character with its world and mythology that audiences have been debating and talking about since inception,” said Kosove and Johnson. “We are excited to continue exploring that world via this anime series.”

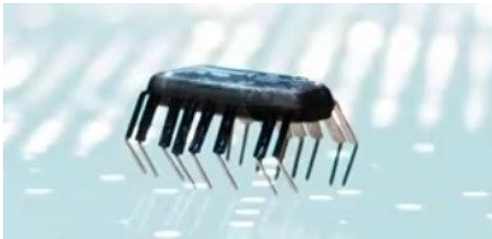

Due to Lincoln's desire to spend more time with his family in England, the actor and former showrunner Scott Gimple had a conversation during Season 4 in which they came to the conclusion to kill off Rick in Season 8. However, Lincoln later realized that he wasn't ready to say goodbye to Rick and they began brainstorming ways for his storyline to continue outside the flagship series.



"As of now, the plan is for each of the films to air on AMC, so don't get your hopes up about a full theatrical release. In Lincoln's final episode of *The Walking Dead*, Rick Grimes was left wounded and flying away in a helicopter with Jadis (Pollyanna McIntosh) toward an unknown destination. The first of the three films will resolve that cliffhanger and explore what Gimple calls the "vast mythology" of a still-mysterious community who collects "A" or "B" people.

The films are only the first step in the expansion of *The Walking Dead* franchise. After being promoted from showrunner to the new position of chief content officer, Gimple began developing numerous projects to make *The Walking Dead* into a *Star Trek*-style multi-platform franchise. As part of Gimple's multi-year plan for *The Walking Dead* universe, there are other projects currently in development, including additional films, specials, series, digital content and more. Some of the stories will relate to *The Walking Dead* as fans know it while others will be standalone stories that introduce new characters and locations. According to *THR*, "Gimple's vision stretches beyond that and includes introducing content with brand new characters, revisiting old fan-favorite and obscure ones and, maybe, spinning off others in shows that could run anywhere from 16-episode seasons to short-order miniseries."

The show's other actors are starting to prepare for the big future, too. *THR* reports that Norman Reedus and Melissa McBride, who play fan-favorite characters Daryl and Carol, have signed lucrative new deals that would allow them to "move freely" throughout the universe, setting them up for their own spin-offs, crossovers or whatever Scott Gimple comes up with for them. Danai Gurira, who is now the second-billed actor on the show behind Reedus and whose profile has raised thanks to *Black Panther*, is reportedly negotiating a similar deal.

More will be revealed at a later date, but the expansion of *The Walking Dead* world is only just beginning.
