TRANSITION TO A NEW ACADEMY SITE

The wait is over! The Support team and the faculty have worked diligently for over a year to bring to the Fleet a user-friendly, up-to-date site for administering all Academy's operations.

The new site opened to the Fleet on May 1, 2017, and the current site will instruct you to go to the new site.

There will be a bit of a learning curve, but this system, with a Moodle foundation, is used all over the US and UK for Academic administration. Our system is a UK-based program, so will have British spellings.

We have chosen the most simple tools to allow the Fleet to take courses either by e-mail, as done now, or by an automated grading system, which will replace Greg Staylor's FAC.

There is a lot of information posted on the main site for the Fleet without your having to create an account and login.

Under INFORMATION on the right

are a number of downloads open to the Fleet.

HOW TO TAKE A COURSE and FAC LISTING are two manuals you should download before you login/create an account.

We invite you to create an account now, if you already do not have one as a member of the staff and faculty, then have a look around. Be aware that each application is put into PENDING until one of us admins check your SCC and membership status, and confirms your registration.

By the time you read this, many goals outlined here will have been reached.

SUPPORT STAFF

As soon as the results of the election were known, and Glen Diebold appointed me to this position, I began to assess the needs of both Academy and the Support Department, so that we could back up Academy operations in an efficient manner.

It was necessary to recruit more staff for the various records we keep and to help the Electronics Department with the huge tasks of completing the projects that were begun the previous year. Dividing up the tasks among assistants and data entry people was a primary goal.

Efficient communications among the members of Support was the second goal, so that documents changes, website access changes, and database and website changes could be made in a timely manner.

By ensuring that every Support member knew his/her duties, and developing a centralized Archive site, we could supply Directors and Command needed information on a moment's notice.

Support will continue to evolve to meet the needs of the Staff and Directors of Academy in the years to come.

ACADEMY WEBSITE

For well over a year, the Support Team has worked with an educational program, called Moodle, which is designed to administer exams and handle Academy operations. Our current operations were scattered across three

servers and many web pages, so we wanted to consolidate them into one program.

Moodle is used in many Schools and Colleges in the US and UK, from Kindergarten through Graduate School. It offers us many options from the simple, to all-encompassing. So we identified the basic operations that STARFLEET Academy has used over the years, and went with what has worked the best for us

The Moodle program was then installed onto Kevin Plummer's Webhosting account in Hostgator.

A previous attempt at managing Moodle on SFI's Site 5 failed, and so we decided to develop the site separate from any other operations. Another issue was the sheer number of people who needed daily, interactive, access to Academy to administer exams and update colleges and Archives. In my opinion, having both the SFI Database and Academy operations under one umbrella is unwise. Should Site 5 go down, ALL SFI operations are down, with no service whatsoever to the Members.

While on Kevin's account, the Team began the arduous task of inputting the curriculum, with the help of staff and directors who were familiar with Moodle. There was a lot of learning, trying a number of ways we wanted the program to work for us, and finding shortcuts. Meanwhile we created working manuals, updating them as we learned more efficient ways of operating.

In January, our main goal was to get the program to send out notices to both students and Directors about exam activity. So it

was necessary for us to put the program on its own domain, and give Academy its own account. Hostgator offered us a generous 3-year start up plan, which I gladly paid in advance, and Kevin, with the help of Chris Hart, an IT in real life, migrated the program over.

Since then, a number of staff and faculty familiar with Moodle have helped us input the curriculum, including the FACs, the Archives, and other important files to the new site.

At first, the task was overwhelming, requiring several people many hours to finish. By the end of March, we had the standard certificates input and assigned to the Courses, and had the notification system working well.

By this time, it looked like we would be able to open the site to just the faculty and staff to beta-test both email-only courses and automated courses, which we still call the FAC, in honor of Greg Staylor's original program.



Beta-testing was planned to begin the first week in April, and a date to open to the Fleet based on how well the beta-testing progressed.

DATA ENTRY TEAM

In January, I created a Data Entry Team and assigned an Institute to each. Each is a volunteer with varying levels of familiarity with Moodle and/or data entry. The Moodle Team worked up a basic manual for these folks to help out their assigned Institutes update their Colleges. Directors who are able, do not have to use the data Entry person to maintain their own Colleges.

Jayden Tyronian is in charge of this team, and once Moodle is up and running, he will parse out simple work orders to the DET members, so he can work on more IT-related tasks.

Work orders from the Deans will still be logged on SFAServices, and the basic maintenance tasks assigned to the proper DET members.

MOVEMENT OF DEAN AND DIRECTOR GROUPS

Because our two Yahoo groups did not allow the admins to directly sub members, and the members who did not have a Yahoo account could not access the groups, I asked Jayden to create new groups with Gmail (Google Groups). We abandoned the Yahoo groups mid-January.

Support is constantly busy providing information and answering questions about the new website. The major support personnel are listed below, but many more people from the faculty help us keep our records updated.

I've always been told since I joined Starfleet Academy, if you walk away from the computer, you never know what you're being volunteered for, but you find out when you return. I started the month as Assistant Academic Coordinator and ended it as Academic Coordinator. I'm practically sleeping with my laptop now...

The Academic Coordinator or AC is responsible for the academics and personnel of Starfleet Academy. Nearly two dozen institutes and over 180 colleges have kept me very busy for the first three months of 2017. Trying to memorize all of those, along with who the Deans, Directors and Assistants are, then the acronyms for it all is a time-consuming confusing job. And as soon as I think I got it, it changes.

I can't thank those that administer and maintain the Academy enough. The time and dedication that has been put into STARFLEET Academy is just phenomenal. If it wasn't for their experience, organizational skills, and staying on top of changes, I wouldn't have a chance of

learning this job.

So, what have I been up to? Just as I was coming in as AC, the administration felt it was time for a purge of older, unpopular exams. A couple Institutes and Colleges were combined or closed. Next to hit was the MSR Director and Dean reports. January's reports were coming in, but trying to find out who and what they were for was one of the most time-consuming jobs I've done for the Academy. The problem was the MSR file names and the Email subject lines were all over the place.

No consistency. Once we got that straightened out, February and March MSR reports were much easier to find, read, and log. Thank you for everyone's continued cooperation with the correct report file naming.

The Moodle Team spent January – March working hard to get the Academy Online ready for beta-testing and to open on May 1st. We encouraged as many Directors as possible to convert their exams to multiple-choice or True/False and enter them into Moodle as FAC exams. Once the Academy Online opened and Directors go to see how it worked, more Directors have opted to add their exams as FACs. For those wondering, there is a FAC list on the front page, that will tell you which colleges have some of their exams online, and which are still email.

Also, coming along nicely is the new Institute of Alternative Medicine, which will house the College of Chiropractic Services, Mortuary Science, and Traditional Medicine. A new language, Azerbaijan was added to CILS. The College of Medicine (CMED) is writing like crazy, and has some fabulous exams that will be available. I joined a group formed to write exams for the upcoming College of Musicals. The Science Fiction TV and Cinema

To assume a vacancy, you must pass all of the exams in the College, or if a College of 35 to 60 exams, 75% of the exams. Colleges over 60 exams are tested out at 50% with a maximum of 50 exams required.

Assistant Directors must meet the same requirements as the Director.

To direct a College of your own creation, first check the College Catalogue to make certain your idea is not already being used.

Carol will determine where your College fits within the Academy structure and introduce you to your Dean who will lead you through the approval process.

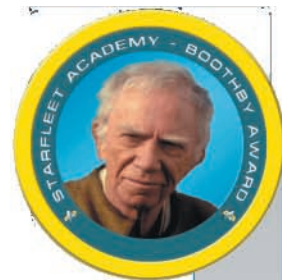

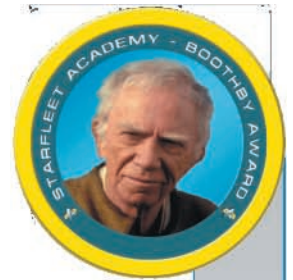

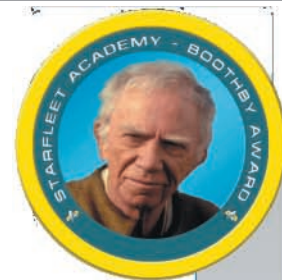

definition of "met" is. In a Broadway theatre, I was in line at the box office, and in front of me was a short, bald man. He turned around and... walked right by me as I stood frozen with my jaw dropped. Thankfully no words were exchanged. Because... apparently I get too worked up in front of my idols.

So yeah... long ago... there was a convention, by Creation, I think... and I went with my pal Ryan. I was so



psyched to see my idol, Marina Sirtis, and we were in line for autographs. I was too poor to buy an official photo so I brought two items with me. Can I just stop the story right now? ... No? ... Ok, so... I finally get up to her table, and... instead of professing my profound adoration of her and what warmth and depth she brought to the role and how I related with everything Troi went through... I guess

I thought that would seem too clingy and stalker-ish, so, with lack of a plan of what to convey during the few, precious moments in her presence... my curiosity took control of my brain and forced my mouth to blurt out, "Is Michael Dorn married?" To which she replied, "Oh, dear, I think you're a bit too young for him". To which I retorted, a bit offended, "No, I know I look young, but I just turned 21. It's fine." I don't remember anything said after that, but

when I took my items from her, my friend pushed me over for his turn, and I looked down to see my thumbprint smudged her freshly-wet-black-marker signature on my bookmark.

Later, during her panel talk, she did shout out to me when it came up that Michael Dorn liked chocolate chip cookies.

I was too traumatized to go to a convention again. Maybe someday.

How did you find out about the STARFLEET International Fan Association, and what made you want to join?

Someone on the internet mentioned it, so I knew it must be true, and I googled until I found it. I read the full SFI website, researched nearby chapters and checked the SFA page. I wanted to join so I could fulfill my fantasy of being a Betazoid counselor on a starship with zany crewmembers, awkward diplomatic missions and potentially lethal adventures in the Holodeck. Amazingly, this has not yet come to fruition.

What interested you about STARFLEET Academy? What courses did you start out taking?

I longed to explore strange new languages, to seek out new trials and new tribulations. I began with the Institute of Alien Studies, quickly followed by Officer Training School and SAOC. I also ordered Star Wars, but never received them. However, I was kept busy with Klingon physiology, Orion customs, and obtaining the Counselor's certification., and correcting errors along the way.

When and how did you**become a Director?**

I kept on sending in corrections on courses, for... months. Finally, the COCD courses asked for feedback, so I sent some, and it was appreciated by the director, who was having to step down due to other duties in life, so he suggested I become director, but that didn't happen right away. Trouble with Tribbles (followed closely by Trials and Tribulations)

What is your least favorite Star Trek episode out of all the series?

Oh gosh. So many to choose from. In Enterprise, when Trip is stuck in the pod for a few days... (the episode is titled "Shuttlepod One", apparently), and he uses mashed potatoes to plug a hole in the hull. I mean... come on. I wanna see proof that's possible in the laws of physics, and yes, I've looked online and still no definite answer. But moreso... (SPOILER ALERT) I really expected that he would be a goner, only to be let down, yet again.

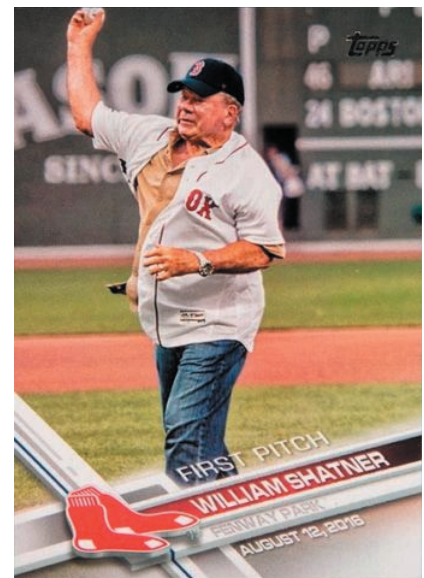

Understand the way a cryptogram works. Most cryptograms or cryptoquotes are basic substitution ciphers, meaning that the letters of the alphabet are being represented by other letters. A cryptogram in Klingon wouldn't be any more difficult to analyse than a cryptogram in Bajoran, because the symbols act as patterns in the end. Find the patterns and you'll crack the code.

In general, look for the patterns underneath the letters. Try to disassociate yourself as much as possible from the letters you're looking at.

Cryptograms don't try to play tricks on you, however difficult they may be. In almost all cryptograms, letters will never stand for themselves. In other words, the "X" in the puzzle you're trying to work out definitely doesn't stand for "X" in the alphabet. Solve one letter at a time. It's unlikely that you'll recognize one mess of jumbled up nonsense letters as a particular word right away, no matter how long you look at it. Try to figure out the most likely single letter words, then carry that substitution through the rest of the puzzle, filling in as many blanks as possible with educated guesses, then filling in the remaining blank spaces.

Completing a cryptogram is a slow process that'll require a lot of guessing. You'll weigh a lot of possibilities and make the best guess at the time. If, later, that guess turns out to be wrong, then change it.




